The NASWA Workforce and Labor Market Information (WLMi) Committee serves as a forum for state labor market information directors and other workforce agency staff to build supportive cross-state relationships, educate national policymakers, and improve state practices in developing and applying labor market statistics and workforce program administrative data for a broad range of customers. The Committee hosts action-oriented policy and practice discussions on workforce and labor market information.

COMMITTEE OBJECTIVES

Respond to Policy Proposals. Provide insights and recommendations on national policy proposals.

Advise and Communicate with NASWA Board of Directors. Alert the NASWA Board of Directors of changes in policy or operations that impact the states.

Share Promising Practices. Through meetings and calls, participate in structured discussions and work collectively to improve the use of WLMi as an asset for workforce development and demonstrate the value of the WLMi Committee within NASWA.

Strengthen Relationships with Federal and State Partners. Continue to strengthen the relationships and leverage assets among NASWA and key partners, such as the LMI Institute and federal agencies, to enhance the WLMi ecosystem. Provide advice to, receive updates from, and inform the priorities and strategies of federal policymakers, researchers and partners.

Collaborate with NASWA Committees. Promote awareness of WLMi products, services and needs and support program leaders' information requirements.

ENGAGEMENT OPPORTUNITIES

The NASWA WLMi Committee generally holds two in-person meetings each Association Year and holds events and calls between meetings. In addition, state leaders nominated to the Committee may contribute to Committee workgroups, including the Performance Measurement Workgroup (with E&T Committee), the WLMi Partners Group (with other national partner entities) and the Data Analytics Using R and Python User Group.
